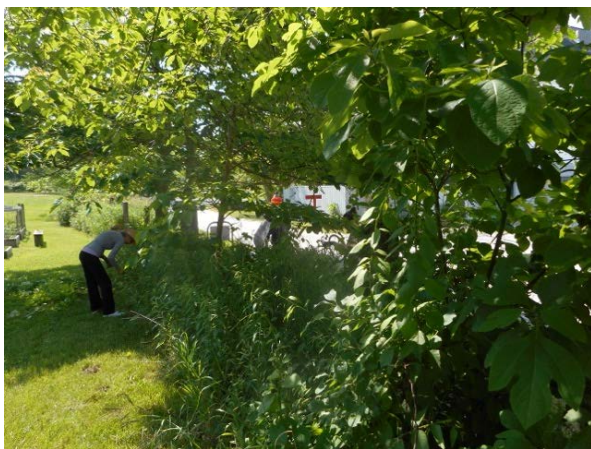
TFI Work Days - Summer Edition

The last two TFI work days have been focused on invasive plant identification and removal. Thank you to everyone who is helping ensure that the Farm continues to thrive.

June 16:

Remove Oriental Bittersweet from garden shed area.



June 17:

Remove Autumn Olive and Oriental Bittersweet from Ebbie's North Meadow and plant Redbud and Hazelnut donated by Richard Matzat. Glad to report this past weekend, the majority of the plantings have taken hold and look healthy!



Aug 12:

Barney assessment and removal of all things invasive. An awesome group of 15 volunteers made a major dent in removing bad actors in the area just south of the Barn. Major thanks to Betsy and Richard for providing direction! A walk in the pond vicinity followed which allowed the tagging of several areas for future work.
